What's it about? A playful, adventurous otter's life is saved twice by humans.

Read-alikes:

- A Rover's Story by Jasmine Warga
- Sea Otter Rescue by Suzi Esterhas
- Saving Winslow by Sharon Creech

If you like animal stories, free verse, or books based on true stories, you will like this book.

Something interesting: When Katherine Applegate was 10 years old, she was featured in her local newspaper as a gerbil saleswoman.

Reading level: Lexile NP (non-prose)

Suggested age: Grades 3-7 (School Library Journal)

The Ogress and the Orphans by Kelly Barnhill

What's it about? A kind ogress helps a poverty-stricken town under the cover of darkness, despite their growing suspicion of strangers.

Read-alikes:

- <u>The Wolf Suit</u> by Sid Sharp
- The Midnight Children by Dan Gemeinhart
- Wishtree by Katherine Applegate

If you like lyrical folk tales and thoughtful themes of community-building, you will like this book.

Something interesting: Kelly Barnhill used to read fairy tales to herself on an abandoned trolley platform in Minneapolis when she was a child.

Reading level: ATOS 5.1

Suggested age: Grades 3-7 (School Library Journal)



Swim Team by Johnnie Christmas

What's it about? In this graphic novel Bree moves to Florida and has to make new friends, learn how to swim and conquer the voice inside of her head that tells her that she will just embarrass herself.

- Stepping Stones by Lucy Knisley

If you like Graphic novels, swimming, Black history, teamwork and friendship, you will like this book.

Something interesting: Johnnie Christmas was born in Puerto Rico, raised in Miami and now lives in Vancouver. He almost drowned as a child, and he didn't learn to swim until he was an adult.

Reading level: ATOS 2.6

Suggested age: Grades 3-6 (School Library Journal)

The Marvellers by Dhonielle Clayton

What's it about? The first Conjuror to attend the Arcanum Training Institute, 11-year-old Ella must prove her innocence with the help of new friends when a dangerous criminal escapes and her mentor disappears.

If you like magical boarding schools, mystery, belonging and friendship, you will like this book.

Something interesting: Dhonielle Clayton spent most of her childhood under her grandmother's table with a stack of books. She was a teacher for several years and is a school librarian.

Reading level: 670L

The Clackity by Lora Senf

What's it about? Twelve-year-old Evie Von Rathe embarks on a journey into a strange world filled with hungry witches, ghosts, and a story thief, to rescue her aunt from a shadowy being called The Clackity.

If you like plot-driven atmospheric horror stories, then you will like this book.

Something interesting: Lora Senf finds inspiration for her spooky stories from her children's dreams and nightmares.

Reading level: 750L

Suggested age: Grades 5+ (Simon & Schuster)

The Last Mapmaker by Christina Soontornvat

What's it about? In a Thai-inspired fantasy world, Sai attempts to build a new life and identity as an aide to the last mapmaker on a voyage set forth by the Queen.

Read-alikes:

- The Last Cuentista by Donna Barba Higuera
- <u>Lintang and the Pirate Queen</u> by Tamara Moss
- The Serpent's Secret by Sayantani DasGupta

If you like adventure, sea voyages, dragons, lost worlds, and coming-of-age journeys, you will like this book.

Something interesting: Christina Soontornvat holds a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering and a master's degree in Science Education. She spent a decade working in the science museum field, where she designed programs and exhibits to get kids excited about science.

Reading level: 740L

A Rover's Story by Jasmine Warga

What's it about? A Rover's Story gives us the internal thoughts and feelings of a new rover getting ready to embark on his epic journey to Mars and his adventures once he reaches the planet.

If you like robots, astronautical roving vehicles, outer space or Mars, you'll love this book!

Something interesting: Did you know that Skittles are the author's favorite candy?

Reading level: ATOS 4.1

Suggested age: Grades 3-5 (School Library Journal)

New from Here by Kelly Yang

What's it about? A story based on the author's own experiences with her family during the COVID pandemic. It follows ten-year-old Knox, his brother, sister, and mom as they leave Hong Kong to seek safety from the virus in the United States.

Read-alikes:

- Mixed Up by Gordon Korman
- Maizy Chen's Last Chance by Lisa Lee

If you like first person stories about overcoming adversity, challenging racism and embracing differences, then you'll like this book!

Something interesting: Kelly Yang immigrated to America from Hong Kong when she was 6 years old. She overcame poverty to go to college at 13 and went on to law school at 17!

Reading Level: 630L

Messy Roots: A Graphic Memoir of a Wuhanese American by Laura Gao

What's it about? A journey toward self-acceptance of queer and Wuhanese American identities, *Messy Roots* is about embracing your past and present, learning to accept where you came from and living authentically.

Read-alikes:

- When Stars Are Scattered by Victoria Jamieson and Omar Mohamed
- Measuring Up by Lily LaMotte
- Welcome to St. Hell: my Trans Teen Misadventure by Lewis Hancox

If you like graphic novels, coming of age stories, LGBTQIA+ stories

Something interesting: The Samuels Public Library almost banned *Messy Roots* because of an effort from a small number of members of the public to censor all materials related to LGBTQIA+ experiences. Luckily, the rest of the community banded together to fight this censorship!

Reading level: Lexile and ATOS not available.

Suggested age: Grades 7+ (School Library Journal)

The Stars Did Wander Darkling by Colin Meloy

What's it about? Construction was being done on the old, and some say cursed, Langdon place. Now all the adults in the town are acting weird, and it is up to Archie and his friends to save their town.

Read-alikes:

- Ghostlight by Kenneth Oppel
- What Lives in the Woods by Lindsay Currie
- The Skull by Jon Klassen

If you like *Stranger Things*, friends having to solve a mystery, and spooky tales, you will like this book.

Something interesting: Colin Meloy is the lead singer in the band *The Decemberists* and knows how to play the bouzouki (which is a musical instrument).

Reading level: ATOS 5.2



Suggested age: Ages 8-12 (Harper Collins)

The Girl Who Fell Beneath the Sea by Axie Oh

What's it about? In order to save her brother, and her homeland, Mina sacrifices herself to solve the storms that have ravaged Mina's homeland for generations.

Read-alikes:

- Song of Silver, Flame Like Night by Amélie Wen Zhao
- We Hunt the Flame by Hafsah Faizal

If you like Studio Ghibli films (particularly *Spirited Away*), swoon worthy romances, and Korean mythology, you will like this book.

Something interesting: Axie Oh really loves her K-Dramas, and some of her books are based on them.

Reading level: 770L

Suggested age: Grades 7+ (School Library Journal)

The Elephant Girl by James Patterson and Ellen Banda-Aaku

What's it about? A twelve-year-old girl, different from most of her peers in the village, deeply cares about a local elephant herd and must face unthinkable challenges as a result.

Read-alikes:

- The Last Beekeeper by Siya Turabi
- Tiger Boy by Mitali Perkins
- Odder by Katherine Applegate

If you like true-to-life stories about protecting wildlife where young protagonists must be brave against all odds, then you will like this book.

Something interesting: Ellen Banda-Aaku is from Zambia and started her writing career late, when she was already over 30! However, she also has a passion for sewing and if she hadn't made it as a writer would probably have "tried (her) hand at fashion." **James Patterson** is the most popular storyteller of our time and is the creator of the *Middle School* and *Treasure Hunters* series.

Reading Level: ATOS 5.2



Suggested Age: Grades 4-6 (School Library Journal)

Echoes and Empires by Morgan Rhodes

What's it about? Josslyn Drake grapples with her identity as rare, illegal, and deadly magic enters her world. Against her better judgement, she must team up with the renegades of magic to save herself.

Read-alikes:

- <u>The Young Elites</u> by Marie Lu
- The Pledge by Kimberly Derting

If you like handsome thieves, forbidden magic, and heart pounding fantasy, you will love the beautifully woven story of *Echoes and Empires*.

Something interesting: A former graphic designer drawn to sparkly objects and fancy handbags, Morgan Rhodes lives in Ontario, where she maintains a very healthy belief in all things magical.

Reading level: 690L

Suggested age: Grades 8+ (School Library Journal)

The Sunbearer Trials by Aiden Thomas

What's it about? Teo is selected for a competition where the winner gets glory, and the loser gets sacrificed.

Read-alikes:

- All Of Us Villains by Amanda Foody
- Spell Bound by F.T. Lukens
- The Percy Jackson series by Rick Riordan

If you like gods and demigods, deadly games, and talking to birds, you will like this book!

Something interesting: Aiden Thomas is a Trans Latinx author and they organize their bookshelves by colour. *The Sunbearer Trials* is their first series, with the second book coming out September 2024.

Reading level: 850L

Places We've Never Been by Kasie West

What's it about? Childhood best friends who haven't seen each other in years reunite on a summer road trip. After a rocky start, their childhood friendship is revived and grows into something new.

Read-alikes:

- Our Way Back to Always by Nina Moreno
- <u>The Getaway List</u> by Emma Lord

If you like light-hearted stories about romance, friendship, family and road trips, you will like this story!

Something interesting: the author has written over a dozen teen romance novels, but she has stated that she will never write a sequel for any of her books.

Reading level: HL560 L

Suggested age: Grades 8+ (School Library Journal)

A Song Called Home by Sara Zarr

What's it about? Eleven-year-old Lou and her older sister Casey navigate the changes that come with their mom's remarriage – new home, new friends, and new schools – as well as their inconsistent relationship with their alcoholic father.

Read-alikes:

- A Soft Place to Land by Janae Marks

If you like realistic stories about friends, families, and new beginnings, you will like this book.

What's it about? A Métis teen must deal with the fallout of long kept secrets, both her family's and her own, while navigating the trauma surrounding her family and her sexuality.

Read-alikes:

- Funeral Songs for Dying Girls by Cherie Dimaline

If you like Indigenous-centered stories about real-life situations that have a touch of romance, you will like this story.

Something interesting: Jen Ferguson's favorite animals are bison and moose. She never worked at an ice cream shack but has run a pizza shop which is the setting of her latest book, *Those Pink Mountain Nights*.

Reading level: ATOS 4.2

Suggested age: Grades 10+ (School Library Journal)

The Agathas by Kathleen Glasgow

What's it about? When Alice's boyfriend-stealing ex-bff Brooke goes missing after a party, she teams up with her tutor, Iris, and her band of misfit friends to discover what really happened, even when it seems like no one in the wealthy town of Castle Cove wants them to.

Read-alikes:

- Someone is Always Watching by Kelley Armstrong
- I'm the Girl by Courtney Summers

If you like sudsy drama, high school betrayal and mysteries told from multiple perspectives.

Something interesting: The creation of one of the characters was inspired by the real-life 11-day disappearance of mystery writer Agatha Christie in 1926.

The Silence That Binds Us by Joanna Ho

What's it about? A Chinese-American teen combats Asian hate and subverts the dominant narrative that explores who gets to tell their story and who gets silenced.

Read-alikes:

- Finding My Voice by Marie Myung-Ok Lee
- Private Label by Kelly Yang

If you like complex characterizations, intense dialogue and books about taking social action, then you will like this book!

Something interesting: The author's ideal vacation involves hiking, tents, waterfalls, mountains, spectacular views and s'mores. This book is inspired by true events that happened in the author's hometown.

Reading Level: ATOS 4.9

Suggested age: Grades 9+ (School Library Journal)

A Magic Steeped in Poison by Judy I. Lin

What's it about? Ning enters a competition in the magical art of tea-making to receive a favour from the princess, which may be her only chance to save her sister's life.

Read-alikes:

- Daughter of the Moon Goddess by Sue Lynn Tan
- <u>The Scarlet Alchemist</u> by Kylie Lee Baker

Something interesting: When asked what kind of dumpling the main character, Ning, would be, the author said she is best represented by the dumpling that appears in the story: the humble zongzi (glutinous rice dumpling). A dumpling with history, associated with remembrance and sacrifice.

What's it about? The long-lost heir to an ancient Jinn kingdom, Alizeh, is forced to hide in plain sight and bide her time in the shadows patiently waiting to uproot the kingdom of the crown prince—and the world.

What's it about? A 17-year-old boy in Romania searches for freedom, truth, and love in a country that is controlled by an evil dictator.
